The Privilege of the Floor:

Daniel Leete, River Rd Hamilton

Daniel was at the meeting to discuss climate change and how it is affecting farming and gardeners and everyone. He asked the Town board what is the Planning Board?

Council Adam Carvell stated that it is an aspiration to set the tone and course for our community but often tends to be more of a responsive board to issues as they arise. in terms of long-term planning more aspiration than possible actual.

Council Greg Fuller stated that it should be long term planning but, in his experience, it is reacting to an immediate need where you see something happening in your community were you general move to adopt local laws to restrict or in direction to keep the needs of the community.

Daniel also discussed chemicals that are being used (Roundup). He would like to create a discussion forum with others about these topics.

Supervisor Ronda Winn stated that if he would like to send an email to her about what he would like to do she would send it out to the residents through email to notify them about this and see if anyone was interested in this. Daniel stated that he cannot find any place in Madison County that offers scientific advice about agriculture and gardening etc. He stated that the planning g board is reactive rather than proactive and is not planning. He would like to do something at a local level.

Supervisor Ronda Winn stated that Cornell Cooperative Extension office is having classes on this, and they have resources for this.

Council Adam Carvell stated that he feels there would be interest in this, talking with Steve Lorraine from Soil & Water, we could get the word out and see who is interested. If an Ad Hoc committee gets formed, they could do determine their own agenda & meeting and then advise the Town Board about issues that the board is not aware of.

The minutes from April 8, 24 regular meeting were amended to make a correction. To remove Council Chadwick Nower stated that we are too small of a township to be able to just pay for the new equipment, we need to finance it.

Change to Council Chadwick Nower stated that as a small Township it is advisable not to deplete funding by purchasing outright select equipment every time it comes along. Financing makes sense at times enabling township to better handle emergencies and gross unforeseen expenses that can arise.

Highway Superintendent: Jamie Goedel

The town will have to buy thirty-eight ½ ton of salt for salt brine. The town of Hamilton will not except the salt that we buy, it is too dirty so we will have to buy salt from the Town of Hamilton.

The highway guys went to Madison County Highway garage for training.

Jamie signed up for Highway school for June 3-5. in Ithaca

Dave's stump grinding will donate his time and equipment to grind the stumps at the cemetery on Geer rd. He would need a couple of hundred dollars to cover the teeth for the grinder.

Repairs:

We will need to go through Bridge New York for the Deep Springs Rd

The engineers have not got back to Jamie about Deep Springs Rd, we need to close this road, the bridge has been Red flagged by New York State.

The last inspection of Deep Spring Rd bridge was 2002. It is the same as what is happening now to this road.

Ordered fabric and crush- run for the road.

We cannot apply to Bridge New York until August. The road will be closed for 2-3 years.

This is a very timely process.

Highway Superintendent Jamie Goedel has talked with the residents of Deep Springs Rd how it will be closed, and they all understand and appreciated that he let them know what was happening.

Jamie talked with Steve Lorraine about Matt Bolinger getting a permit to build a bridge so he can still get his crops in.

Once we get the bridge completed it will go back to Madison County and they will be responsible for it.
